Also included is the provision of classroom-based mental health programs by hiring Mental Health consultants to do observations, interventions, consultations, and training.
2	Girls Incorporated of Alameda County	San Leandro	North=100%	\$150,000	Provide mental health consultation (primarily organization/classroom-focused) at two east Oakland preschools to improve overall preschool quality through staff (line staff, Center Directors, and executive management) ongoing training, observations, and reflective supervision.
3	Jewish Family & Children's Services of the East Bay	Berkeley	North=84% South=16%	\$150,000	Provide relationship-based early childhood mental health consultation services at 10 preschool sites, including 2 West Oakland schools that are part of Parent-Child Development Center, Inc. and 8 schools throughout Alameda County in the Jewish preschool system.
4	Parental Stress Services, Inc.	Oakland	North=100%	\$150,000	Provide comprehensive mental health consultation services in two child development centers operated by Oakland Unified School District and located in East Oakland, serving primarily low-income, African-American children. Activities will include staff training and consultation, classroom observation, onsite play therapy groups, and referrals to psychotherapy services.
5	The Link to Children	Oakland	North=100%	\$150,000	Continue providing preschool consultation and direct services (such as play therapy and parenting counseling), teacher stipends, enhanced agency training of interns and support staff, and evaluation of the program.

2	Alameda Unified School District	Alameda	North=100%	\$149,236	Increase the school readiness for children in the West End of Alameda by expanding our home visiting services for families with children prenatal to 5 by hiring bilingual and multicultural Family Advocates and implementing a Kindergarten Readiness Summer Program.
3	Association of Children's Services	Oakland	North=100%	\$150,000	Continue "Growing with Music," a Saturday preschool kindergarten readiness and parent education program collaborating with Hawthorne Elementary School Family Resource Center for children 0-5 who are not in licensed childcare. Activities will include outreach to target children not in licensed care, development of evaluation plan and tools, literacy enrichment services, and incentives to participating families.
4	City of Oakland, Department of Human Services (Even Start Program)	Oakland	North=100%	\$150,000	Expand and enhance by 20 families the City of Oakland's Even Start program in adult literacy, parenting instruction, home visits, and literacy activities in East Oakland's Elmhurst District.

3	Hayward Adult School - Parent Education Department (HPED)	Hayward	South=100%	\$49,004	Expand and enhance successful parenting program serving 450 families with children 0-5 each week, in English and Spanish. Funding will increase class hours in Spanish, teacher training, program coordination, and classroom materials.
4	Pleasanton Unified School District/Horizon High for Teenage Mothers and Fathers	Pleasanton	Tri=100%	\$148,500	Enhance parenting education program for at-risk teen mothers and young fathers utilizing multiple strategies. These include supervised play, peer coaching, individualized and group instruction as well as home visits and peer support with the result that children will experience emotional, physical, and economic well being.
5	Regents of the University of California	Berkeley	South=100%	\$115,265	In collaboration with Lawrence Hall of Science and Another Road to Safety, provide science and mathematics activities to families with children ages 2-5 who are at risk of child abuse and neglect. Types of activities will include parent/child classes, parent education, take home materials, and yearly science fairs in Hayward.

Activities will include the establishment of adoption community centers within churches, doubling the number of monthly adoption information meetings, and expanding the number and diversity of families receiving information about BAPRC's programs.
6	Child Care Links	Pleasanton	Tri=100%	\$150,000	Continue, expand, and enhance our Family Read Night program including: a Literacy Fair, provider workshops, Farsi, and afternoon and on-site center based Family Read Night sessions.
7	Children's Fairyland	Oakland	North=45% South=45% Tri=10%	\$120,332	Expand and improve existing school readiness programs by developing a comprehensive system of outreach to providers for low-income pre-school aged children in the greater Bay Area. Other activities include strengthening and expanding our multilingual curricula for field trips and activity packages for visitors as well as providing weekly family workshops that relate to Fairyland Curricula.
8	Children's Hospital Oakland - Parent-Infant Program	Oakland	North=52% South=41% Tri=7%	\$150,000	Support the Early Childhood Mental Health Training Program that would provide training to 60 trainees and ECMH treatment services to at least 300 children, birth to five, and their families. Outreach efforts will be continued in order to attract and support a culturally and linguistically diverse trainee group.
9	Community Drug Council, Inc	Fremont	South=100%	\$98,175	Prevention of higher incidence of risk to children 0-5 by providing home based intensive support for families with children in childcare exhibiting behavioral problems, relationship issues, and developmental difficulties. Individual service and treatment plans as well as childcare and mental health consultation to caregivers will be provided.
10	Dental Health Foundation	Oakland	North=60% South=30% Tri=10%	\$149,908	Work with 20 subsidized childcare centers with the goals of increased access to dental care for over 375 children 0-5 per year, increased access to well child exams, and increased identification and referral of children 0-5 with chronic health conditions. 300 additional referrals will be made.

Other activities include hiring Vietnamese-speaking staff and updating and disseminating a Resource Directory.
13	Family Support Services of the Bay Area	Oakland	North=60% South=30% Tri=10%	\$150,000	Provide an array of respite services via carefully trained providers to grandparents and other relative caregivers who have the full-time responsibility of raising their relative children ages 0-5. FSSBA will pilot two programs: a recreation/socialization group during the weekdays for children 0-5 and a caregiver participation component for selected group respite activities.
14	Literacyworks	Emeryville	North=45.07% South=35.56% Tri=19.37%	\$149,960	Continue broadcasting "Childhood Matters," the weekly radio talk show for parents, to enhance services (such as parenting tips) for monolingual speakers of Spanish and to further develop the Web site.
15	Luna Kids Dance	Berkeley	North=75% South=25%	\$99,746	Continue, expand and sustain MPACT (Moving Parents and Children Together) project for families in Alameda County's dependency and child welfare systems. MPACT will continue working with Mandela House and will establish relationships with a new residential center and four new agencies.
16	Museum of Children's Art (MOCHA)	Oakland	North=90% South=10%	\$150,000	Expand Little Studio programs' hours and outreach for low-income families/childcare providers with children 0-5. Targeted outreach/expansion of services to non-English speaking families/children providers, especially those speaking Spanish or Cantonese.
17	Saint Joseph's Center For the Deaf and Hard of Hearing	Hayward	North=37% South=37% Tri=26%	\$150,000	Expand Mental Health Services for Deaf families and children, as well deaf teens who are either pregnant or have recently given birth and are raising their children, by expanding counseling and parent education availability. Implement a new program for families who are considering or whose young children have already received a Cochlear Implant.
18	Tiburcio Vasquez Health Center, Inc.	Hayward	South=100%	\$150,000	Provide and expand parenting classes to Head Start families and TVHC training to staff in Hayward, as well as mental health services, including staff consultation to Head Start families and staff.
19	Tri-City Health Center	Fremont	South=100%	\$150,000	Conduct outreach, promote prenatal care at health fairs and special events, provide comprehensive parenting education to parents of 0 to 5 year olds and train providers on parent education topics.
20	Tri-Valley Haven	Livermore	North=2% South=3% Tri=95%	\$150,000	Increase access to parenting classes and family services for parents of children under five. This effort will target Hispanic families, males, teen parents, and pregnant women, separately or together. Incentives will be offered.
21	Urban Indian Health Board, Inc.	Oakland	North=100%	\$150,000	Promote breastfeeding and physical activity through classes and individual support that will develop stronger parent/child relationships, cognitive and physical skills, and promote lifelong health.
